What is childlike faith

In a Christian context, childlike faith refers to a type of faith that is characterized by trust, humility, simplicity, and wonder. Childlike faith is an approach to belief and relationship with God that is marked by a lack of skepticism, an open-mindedness, and a willingness to believe and obey. It is often compared to that of a child's trust and belief in their parents. This type of faith is seen as pure and unadulterated by the cynicism and skepticism that often comes with age and life experience. In the Bible, Jesus teaches that in order to enter the kingdom of heaven, one must become like a child (Matthew 18:3).

Characteristics of child-like faith

- **Open-mindedness**: Childlike faith is characterized by an openness to new experiences and a willingness to learn and grow in one's relationship with God.
- **Unconditional Love**: Childlike faith is characterized by unconditional love for God and others, regardless of their actions or behavior.
- **Acceptance**: Childlike faith is characterized by acceptance of God's will and plan for one's life, even if it is difficult to understand or accept.
- **Confidence**: Childlike faith is characterized by confidence in the promises of God and the assurance that He will always be with us.
- Childlike Faith is not naive, but rather it's the ability to believe even if things don't
 make sense and to trust God no matter what the circumstances.
